The Argument for Good Punctuation

Why bother? Does it really matter? Do the great unwashed masses notice the difference?



Why Bother?

- **Myth:** The average reader is *punctuationally illiterate*.
- **Reality:** Someone who can't cook can still recognize good food!
- **Myth:** The focus of our jobs as TCs isn't to be the Punctuation Police.
- **Reality:** Yes, but if *we* don't get it right, no one will.
- **Bottom line:** It really matters!



Punctuation and Parsing

Our brain needs punctuation to grasp meaning:

- woman without her man is nothing
- Woman without her man is nothing.
- Woman: without her, man is nothing.
- Only Senator Fredericks is capable of stopping the strike, and the moment he stops demonstrating that, he has no control over the unions...
- Only Senator Fredericks is capable of stopping the strike, and the moment he stops demonstrating that he has no control over the unions...



Data

Mistakes in punctuation:

- Slow down reading rate.
- Reduce comprehension.
- Make users suspicious of the documentation.
- Create an image of inferior quality of the product.

The Basic Punctuation Marks

Let's review the basics, including proper usage and special conditions in TC.

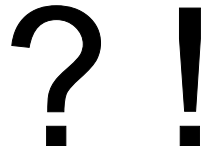


Full Stops ■

- A full stop (aka period) is required at the end of every full sentence.
- All procedure steps are complete sentences.
- Items that are not full sentences (such as bullet list items) do not require closing punctuation.
- Consider going back to French spacing.



Question Marks and Bangs



- If it is a question, use a question mark.
 - Can you name the 15 largest cities in Israel?
 - Do you have time to meet this afternoon?
- Avoid the common mistakes.
 - Is there room in your carpool for me.
 - The poodle ate your homework?
- Use bangs (aka exclamation points) with discretion.



Commas ,

- Use the breathing rule.
- Avoid the ultimate mistake of the too-weak comma.
 - It was too cold, they went inside.
- Use closed vs. open punctuation.
 - Open: apples, oranges and pears
 - Closed (aka the serial comma; preferred for TC): red, blue, and green
- Use the optional comma.
 - Use with all conditionals and similar constructs
 - From the main toolbar, select...
 - If the system times out, reset...
- Multiple adjectives no longer always need commas.



Colons



-
- Use colons to introduce lists or offset quotations.
 - Avoid using in titles.
 - Do not capitalize after a colon in running text.
 - The system sets three levels: normal function, exception cases, and emergencies.
 - Remember, colons in running text may be a red flag to break things out into lists!



Semicolons ;

- Use a semicolon to connect related independent clauses.
 - Roger was hammered; he regretted those last five margaritas.
- Use to separate items in a complex list.
 - System function follows a set pattern: the value is passed to the server; the packet is checked; the data is compiled.
- Again, this can be a red flag to break things out.



Dashes



- Use a hyphen for:
 - Hyphenated compounds (mass-produced)
 - Stacked modifiers (water-table analysis mode)
 - End-of-line hyphenation
 - Minus sign in equations
- Use an en dash to indicate a range.
 - Read pp. 27–48.
 - The course runs from June–September.
- Use an em dash to separate clauses.
 - Sue felt queasy—those seven corn dogs were barking.
- Don't bound dashes with spaces.



Parentheses

()

- Use for spell-outs of acronyms and initializations.
 - Version 7.2 supports TBC (Total Bovine Control).
- Use for layered detail.
 - Household pets (including fish) must be licensed.
- Punctuate parentheticals properly.
 - ...poodles (see *Dorky Pets*, p. 43).
 - ...poodles. (For more details, see *Dorky Pets*, p. 43.)
- What do they imply?

Quotation Marks

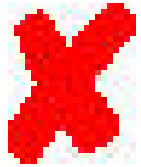
- Use printers' quotation marks rather than straight ASCII quotes.
- Follow proper usage rules.
 - Direct quotes (Egbert said, “Boy, I hate my job.”)
 - Journal articles (Parker Pinkerton, “The Power of Pulp,” *Science*, May 2004)
- Punctuation goes *inside* quotation marks.
- Incorrect usage is linked to a negative implication.
 - Moshe is “out sick” today.
- Avoid single quotes.

Capitalization

- Use title capitalization for all headings.
 - Creating a Disaster Recovery Plan
- Use title capitalization for interface elements.
 - Bad: In the New User dialog box, select Color defined by user.
 - Better: In the New User dialog box, select Color Defined by User.
- Avoid sentence capitalization for proper nouns.



Miscellaneous

- Virgule (aka slash or solidus) /
- Back slash (aka reverse solidus or slosch) \
- Pipe (aka vertical line or bar) |
- Brackets (aka square brackets) []
- Braces (aka curly braces) { }
- Angle brackets (aka less-than and greater-than signs) < >
- Asterisk (aka star or splat) *
